

Archery

Risks:

1. Being hit by an arrow
2. Injury from walking into a grounded or targeted arrow
3. Injury whilst removing a targeted arrow
4. Injury from the misfiring of an arrow

Risk	Risk Management
all	a. Instructors will have been trained and assessed by the Centre Manager.
all	b. Instructor to student ratio will not exceed 1:14.
all	c. Safety procedures and an invitation for risk disclosure will be included in the student briefing.
1	d. No one will go past the clearly defined firing point whilst shooting is in progress.
1	e. Students will be given clear instructions as to when to shoot and when to collect arrows.
1	f. The command "STOP" will be used to stop all activity immediately.
1	g. For indoor shooting, doors will be locked and signs used to stop people entering the danger area during an archery session.
4	h. Students will be matched to a bow of suitable size and draw weight.
1,4	i. A bow and arrow will never be aimed at anything other than the proper target.
4	j. Only trained instructors will string the bows.
2,3	k. Instructors will ensure that students are taught the correct technique for removing arrows from the ground and target, students will not walk directly towards the face of the target when collecting arrows.
