Camping

Risks:

1. Wandering away from campsite & getting lost
2. Injury from use of fires & stoves
3. Danger from flash floods, rockfalls, fire, falling trees, etc.

Risk	Risk Management
all	a. Instructors will hold the relevant BELA or MLTB award. At the discretion of the Centre Manager staff who have completed BELA training can lead local walks solo when being supervised by a suitably qualified person appointed by the Centre Manager.
all	b. Instructor to student ratio will not exceed 1:8.
1	c. On arrival at the campsite students will be briefed on clear boundaries and a suitable lost procedure.
2	d. Students will be instructed on the safe use of camp fires and stoves. Use of these will be directly supervised by the instructor, normally at a central location. Stoves will not be used inside tents.
3	e. Instructors will consider dangers from the environment when selecting camp sites.
3	Students will not smoke or light fires inside tents. Students are to be instructed on how to escape a burning tent.
all	f. Appropriate emergency equipment (first aid kit, group shelter, mobile phone, radio) will be carried.
