Risk Management

- | Risk | Risk Management |
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| all | a. Instructors will have been trained and assessed by the Centre Manager. |
| all | b. Instructor to student ratio will not exceed 1:14. |
| all | c. Safety procedures and an invitation for risk disclosure will be included in the student briefing. |
| 1 | d. Participants will not climb above the specified height, holds will not be placed above that height |
| 1 | e. Clear Signage will be placed on wall to instruct the dangers of climbing too high |
| 1 | f. Clear signage and instruction will advise participants to not climb around doors |
| 1 | k. Participants will wear appropriate footwear |
| 1 | l. the wall will be checked regularly to ensure there are no loose/spinning holds |
| 2 | m. Participants will be made aware of the danger from inserting fingers into bolts holes and gaps between boards |
| 3 | n. participants will be instructed and guided by signage not to place hands on top of wall. |

4. o. A warm up will be carried out by instructors before traverse sessions
4. p. Participants will be instructed that when using the traverse wall unsupervised they use large holds and avoid 'crimps'.
5. q. participants will be advised of the dangers of climbing to close to one another, unless supervised by instructors.
